

Why study in Australia

Welcoming and multicultural

Australia's international student population is high in comparison to the US with around 24% vs 3% in the US. Better value for money

Australian education programs represent great value for money. Australian courses are often shorter than alternatives in other countries, particularly in the US. Most Australian bachelor degree courses can be completed in three years and even less if the education provider works on a trimester system. This means that you can save a whole year's tuition fees if you choose to study in Australia rather than in the US or the UK.

High rates of employment and work rights

Australia's strong economy and high employment mean international students who wish to work have no problems finding a job. International students also have work rights during their study in Australia – both when they are studying and on university holidays. According to the Australian Department of Home Affairs, once student's courses commence, they are permitted to work a maximum of 40 hours per fortnight when their courses are in session, and unlimited hours when their courses are out of session. Australia also boasts unique post study work rights, that are unmatched in other countries. This gives graduates the opportunity to start their global career in Australia.
