Academic English

Our Academic English (AE) programs provide you with the English language and academic literacy skills required for entry to an English speaking university.

Duration: 200 hours / 10 weeks per level

- International student who has completed Year 10 or equivalent
- Demonstrate good passing grades in main academic subjects + English
- · Must provide the last three school reports (in English).

English entry requirements

A minimum of ONE of the below requirements:

- AEAS: Score 57 or above (equivalent to IELTS 5.5). AEAS Report.
- Evidence of studying for a minimum of two years at a school where all subjects, except languages, were taught in English.
- IELTS (Academic/Online): 5.5 Overall, min 5.0 all skills.
- TOEFL iBT: 58, 16 in writing.
- UTS College English AE3: Pass grade.
- Pearson PTE: Overall, 46, min 38 all skills.
- C1 Advanced/C2 Proficiency: Overall 162, min 154 all skills.
