Frequently Asked Questions

Campus and Service Locations

Why is UTS College moving?

UTS College is moving out of the Blue Building at 187 Thomas Street Haymarket. The College is co-locating with UTS to improve our students' on-campus experience and align UTS College further with UTS.

Where is UTS College moving to?

UTS College classes and student services currently located in the Blue Building at 187 Thomas Street, Haymarket will move to UTS Building 5 (CB05) located at 1–59 Quay Street Haymarket NSW 2000.

The old market building with its landmark bell tower was previously the UTS Library and UTS Faculty of Law before their relocation to UTS Central.

UTS College corporate and professional services and head office will move to Levels 12 & 13, Building 10 (CB10.13), 235 Jones Street, Broadway NSW 2007. Corporate reception will be located on Level 13.

Classes and services at 609 Harris Street and 645 Harris Street will continue as normal.

When is UTS College moving?

Students and teachers for Science, Business, Engineering and IT will be located in Building 5 from commencement of Semester 3, 2022 – 26 September 2022.

The Student Centre, Study Success Advisers, and IT Service Desk will be located in Building 5 and open for students from **Monday 12 September 2022**.

The new HELPS Centre will open its doors on Monday 26 September 2022.

What are the benefits of moving to UTS Campus Building 5?

Moving on to the UTS campus will provide students with a similar campus-life experience that UTS students enjoy. The facilities are modern with state-of-the-art IT equipment, helping to improve connectivity and learning for students. The campus offers several student lounge areas, new science labs, and onsite IT, student and HELPS services.

Will UTS College have a new postal address?

Yes. From 1 January 2023, UTS College's postal address will be:

Who will be moving to UTS Building 5 (CB05)?

All student services and classes for Science, Business, Engineering and IT will be located in UTS Building 5. ITDS Service Desk, HELPS Centre, Welfare and Accommodation Services and the Student Centre, including student advisers and Study Success Advisers, will also be in Building 5.

How will class locations be identified in my timetable?

There are 28 classrooms across Blocks B and C in Building 5. Your class will be identified in your timetable as: Campus Building Number & Block. Level. Room Number.

For example, if your class is in Building 5, Block B, Level 4, Room 23, your class location will be written as: **CB05B.04.023**

What areas of Building 5 are reserved for UTS College?

UTS College will be located in Block C Levels 1 and 2, and Block B Levels 4 and 5.

Will UTS College be sharing their space with UTS?

Initially, UTS College will have exclusive use of **level 4** and **level 5**, **Block B** and **level 1** and **level 2**, **Block C** in **Building 5**. This may change in future depending on our students' needs. Other groups will occupy other areas of Building 5, however, this will not impact on UTS College students.

Where is the HELPS Centre located?

The HELPS Centre is located on Level 1 (ground floor), Block C, Building 5.

Where is the Student Centre located?

The Student Centre, including Study Success Advisers, is located on Level 1 (ground floor), Block C, Building 5.

I am a Science student, where will my classes be?

From Semester 3, 2022, Diploma of Science classes held on campus will be in CB05, Block C, primarily in the science labs. You can get help to find your classes from the Student Centre or the HELPS Centre.

I am a Business student, where will my classes be?

From Semester 3, 2022, Diploma of Business classes held on campus will be in CB05, Block B or C. You can get help to find your classes from the Student Centre or the HELPS Centre.

I am an Engineering student, where will my classes be?

From Semester 3, 2022, Diploma of Engineering classes held on campus will be in CB05, Block C, primarily in the computer labs. You can get help to find your classes from the Student Centre or the HELPS Centre.

I am an IT student, where will my classes be?

From Semester 3, 2022, Diploma of IT classes held on campus will be in CB05, Block C, primarily in the computer labs. You can get help to find your classes from the Student Centre or the HELPS Centre.

I am a Communication student. Will I be moving?

No. Communication programs will continue to be taught at **645 Harris** Street, Ultimo.

I am a Design & Architecture student. Will I be moving?

No. Classes for Design & Architecture will continue to be taught at **609** Harris Street Ultimo.

I am a UTS Foundation Studies student. Will I be moving?


No. UTS Foundation Studies will continue to be taught at **645 Harris Street**, **Ultimo**.

I am studying English at UTS College. Will I be moving?

No. English language programs will continue to be taught at **645 Harris** Street, Ultimo.

Will any classes continue in the Blue Building?

No. From Semester 3, 2022, classes will no longer be taught at 187 Thomas Street Haymarket.



Facilities and Services

What student facilities are available in Block B?

12 classrooms are located on Level 4 and 5 of Block B. Student facilities in Block B include:

Student breakout areas:

- two large areas to rest, relax, and study
- device charging stations
- 55" digital signage screens.

Balconies:

- areas adjacent to main breakout areas on Levels 4 and 5
- overlooking garden courtyard.

What student facilities are available in Block C?

The following College facilities and services are located on **Level 1** (ground floor) of Block C:

- UTS College Student Centre (for UTS College enquiries only)
- HELPS Centre with lounge and 16 student workspaces
- Welfare and Accommodation Services
- ITDS Service Desk
- computer labs
- classrooms for Engineering, IT, Business and Science.

The following College facilities and services are located on **Level 2 of Block C**:

- 11 classrooms for up to 20 students in each
- science labs including a dry lab
- student printer located outside room 56.

Is there a café onsite?

Not currently. This may change in future. However, we are centrally and conveniently located only a short walk from a wide variety of shops, cafes and restaurants, including Darling Square and Chinatown.

Do I need a pass to get into the building?

No. The campus will be open and freely accessible from 8am to 6pm Monday to Friday.

Can I get a tour of the new campus?

Yes. Campus tours will be available for all students in Semester 3 along with other student activities. See our current and upcoming student events on our website for more details.

Is the campus BYOD?

Yes. Students are expected to bring their own devices (BYOD) to class. Charging stations are available in the common areas of the campus.

Lockers

I currently have a locker in the Blue Building. When do I need to collect anything I have stored in it?

Communications will be sent to students to make sure you collect your belongings before UTS College relocates. However, you should make sure that you have collected any belongings by the end of Semester 2 (Friday 9 September).

What if I can't get to the Blue Building to collect my belongings in time?

If you're unable to get to the College to retrieve your belongings, please contact the Student Centre who will assist you.

What's the last day I can access the Blue Building?

Classes, the Student Centre, HELPS, Welfare and Accommodation and ITDS Help Desk will be moving from the Blue Building to Building 5 from mid-September to start classes for Semester 3 at the new campus. While some corporate staff will continue to work in the Blue Building until December, there will be no need for students to access the building from Semester 3 2022. You should collect any belongings from your locker by the end of Semester 2.

How many lockers are available for students?

About 70 lockers will be available for students in Building 5.

How do I get access to a locker?

Students will not be allocated permanent lockers. You'll be able to enter your own code on any available locker to open and close it.

Will I need a key to access my locker?

No. Student lockers are not operated by key, they are accessed by entering a four digit number. Instructions will be located on the lockers.

How big are the lockers?

Student lockers are 33cm wide, 40cm high, and 45cm deep. This is big enough for a backpack and a few other small belongings. There will also be about 30 larger lockers available if required that are: 30cm wide, 85cm high, and 45cm deep.

Where in CB05 will student lockers be located?

Most lockers for students will be in the main breakout areas of Block B, Level 4 and 5. Some may be available in Block C, Level 1 and 2 if needed

What if I can't find my new class on campus?

If you are unsure of how to find your class, there is a wayfinding display outside the HELPS Centre. The Student Centre also offers a Concierge service. Like an Apple store, you'll see a friendly staff member with an iPad ready and available to help you find what you need.

Is the new location wheelchair accessible?

Yes. Access to all UTS Buildings meet Building Code of Australia (BCA) and the Disability (Access to Premises - Buildings) Standards (Premises Standards), to provide access for people with disabilities. The UTS map indicates accessibility to a broad range of services including ramps, restrooms, and parking.

Are there prayer rooms at the new campus?

Prayer rooms in <u>UTS Building 3</u> are available for UTS College students. Rooms 006 and 004 are booked by the UTS Muslim Society. Room 029 is accessible for students of other faiths. Please contact UTS's <u>multi-faith chaplaincy services</u> for any specific support or information you need.

Will there be security services located in CB05?

A security office, guard and wardens who can provide first aid are located in Block C, Level 2, Room 32 (CB05C.02.032). There will also be roaming security controls in Building 5. For emergencies, call 6 (internal telephones) or **ph: 1800 249 559**.

Where can I get medical help?

For medical assistance, visit the UTS Medical Service on Level 6 (CB01.06.01), Tower (Building 1), Broadway Campus. More information can be found on the **UTS website**.

First aid kits are located throughout our Building 5 campus. Security officers trained in first aid are located in room 32, Level 1, Block C. For emergencies, call 6 (internal telephones) or **ph: 1800 249 559**.

Can I smoke on campus?

No. Our campus is non-smoking, including vaping and e-cigarettes. Designated smoking areas are located in UTS Building 1 (levels 4, 5, 6) and 6 (level 4). If you smoke outside campus, you must stay at least 4 metres away from all entrances. More information can be found on the UTS website.
