You may apply early to secure your place with us and set up your path to UTS and beyond.

UTS Insearch has a wide range of pathway programs leading to UTS, with some of our courses offering guaranteed entry in a UTS bachelor's degree if GPA criteria is met. For many of our programs you'll receive Credit Points towards UTS degrees.

Pre-requisites

Required Knowledge for the UTS Insearch Diploma of Engineering.

The UTS Insearch Diploma of Engineering accelerated (2 semester) and standard (3 semester) program is offered to students who have successfully completed Year 12 subjects in Mathematics, Physics and/or Chemistry.

Students who do not meet the pre-requisite may be considered for the extended program (4 semesters). The extended program includes three additional enabling subjects to ensure students have the core fundamentals before progressing onto more advanced subjects.

Applicants with recent secondary education (within the past two years)

As a Year 12 student completing your Higher School Certificate (HSC) in NSW, you may apply to us directly, we do not use the Australian Tertiary Admissions Ranking (ATAR) for admission to our courses. Instead, we use the average mark from the HSC results, calculated from your results in English and three best non-Vocation Education & Training (VET) HSC subjects (all 4 subjects must be A Category).

Interstate or overseas year 12

Interstate

If you have completed your HSC in Queensland, assessment is based on your Overall Position (OP).

International Baccalaureate is assessed based on your final Aggregate (forecast results accepted if official results are pending release).

Overseas

If you are an Australian citizen or a permanent resident who has completed high school education overseas, you may be eligible to use your results to study a Diploma at UTS Insearch. In some cases, additional English requirements may apply. Finished secondary education more than two years ago

If you have completed secondary education more than two years ago, please <u>contact us</u> for more information.

Applicants with higher education study

If you have completed a higher education program with another provider, or have commenced a bachelor's degree, you may be able to use that qualification to apply for an UTS Insearch Diploma course. You will need to provide your HSC results, up to date Higher Education transcript and final qualification if available, at time of application.

Subjects completed in your previous study that are comparable to subjects of your chosen UTS Insearch Diploma program may be used as credit towards your Diploma, reducing both cost and possibly length of study. Applications for Recognition of Prior Learning can be made at time of application. Please contact us for more information, additional information can also be found in our Recognition of Prior Learning Policy.

Applicants with vocational education and training (VET) study

If you have completed a Diploma level qualification that is recognized by the <u>Australian Qualifications</u> <u>Framework (AQF)</u>, it may be used as a basis for admission into one of our Diploma programs. Please provide us with your transcript and Diploma at time of application.

Subjects completed in your previous study that are comparable to subjects of your chosen UTS Insearch Diploma program may be used as credit towards your Diploma, reducing both cost and possibly length of study. Applications for Recognition of Prior Learning can be made at time of application. Applicants with work and life experience

Work and life experience are not criteria of our assessment.

Domestic applicants with overseas qualification

If you are an Australian citizen or a permanent resident who has completed high school education overseas, you may be eligible to use your results to study a Diploma at UTS Insearch. In some cases, additional English requirements may apply. Please refer to our Academic and English Entry Requirements, and our experienced staff are here to support you with any questions.

English language proficiency

At UTS Insearch, all courses are taught in English, relying on different levels of proficiency.

If English is not your first language, you may also need to satisfy the English language requirements for your preferred course. UTS Insearch offers high quality Academic English courses to enable you meet these requirements. Learning English here is a life-changing experience, and our programs can help improve your ability to communicate in English and gain the skills to succeed in your academic study.

How to apply

You can submit your application <u>online</u> if you have completed or will complete HSC in NSW. Applications for assessment based on qualifications other than NSW HSC must be submitted by email, in person or by post. For paper-based applications, please download our <u>Domestic Application Form</u> and follow the How to apply guide on page two.

Apply online

If you are an Australian citizen, permanent resident or New Zealand citizen and are about to complete your HSC in NSW, you can apply online by entering your information and attach relevant documents.

Apply by email

To submit your application by email, complete our <u>Domestic Application Form</u> and send it together with all relevant documents outlined in the form to registrar@insearch.edu.au



Apply in person

You can visit our Student Centre to lodge your application. Bring along the completed <u>Domestic Application</u> <u>Form</u> and supporting documents outlined in the form.

Our Student Centre is located on the Ground Floor, 187 Thomas Street, Sydney NSW 2000, and we are open Monday to Friday (9am – 5pm) except Public Holidays.

Apply by post

You can also post your application. Complete our <u>Domestic Application Form</u> and return it together with all necessary documents outlined in the application form to: UTS Insearch Student Admissions, PO Box K1085, Haymarket NSW 1240, Australia.

Process

There is no application fee for Domestic students to apply for a course at Insearch.

If you are eligible to apply online, you are issued with a provisional offer within two business days.

If you lodge your application by email, you'll hear back from us within two business days.

Postal applications may take a bit longer, and you'll hear back from us via email within two to four business days from the date we receive your application.

If you prefer to visit us, your application will be assessed on the spot.

Note; for all applications not lodged online, please ensure that you provide us with a fully completed application form and all necessary supporting documents outlined in our Domestic Application Form.

Applications for credit of prior learning can be lodged at the same time as submitting your application for entry into UTS Insearch. However, applications for exemptions with all necessary documentation can be made up until the end of week one of the first semester of study at UTS Insearch. A decision will be made within five business days of receiving a completed application. Please refer to our <u>Recognition of Prior Learning Policy</u> for additional information or <u>contact us</u> to find out more.

Enrolment

Accepting your offer

Once you have received an offer, we invite you to accept that offer so you can get started on your higher education journey.

Provisional Offer

If you have a provisional offer letter, please contact the Admissions Team by email registrar@insearch.edu.au or by phone: +61 2 9218 8689 to seek advice about how to finalise your offer and enrolment.

Full Offer

Once you have received your full offer to study at UTS Insearch, please read through the letter carefully. When you are ready to accept the offer, follow the detailed instructions on how secure a place in your preferred Diploma program at UTS Insearch. You will need to accept our offer, and either pay your fees or apply for FEE-HELP (if eligible).

Accepting your offer and applying for FEE-HELP is done online via eStudent, by following the instructions outlined in our offer letter. If you are under 18 years of age, the acceptance form needs to be signed by you and your parent/legal guarding and returned as outlined in the offer. You may still apply for FEE-HELP online.

For offer acceptances other than FEE-HELP, you can accept your offer using eStudent following the instructions outlined in our offer letter, and you will need to provide us with proof of payment to finalize admission.

Prepare for enrolment and orientation

To prepare for your on-campus orientation and enrolment sessions, please check your Academic Orientation and Prep Week Letter that will be sent to your email address two weeks prior to the course commencement. The letter includes detailed information about dates, times and locations, what to bring, what to expect, and any other information that may be relevant to your Diploma.

In the meantime, after admission for your preferred Diploma program has been finalised, we'll provide you with information what you can do to get ready for your study.

Enrolment

Enrolment for all our Diploma programs is completed on campus in designated enrolment sessions, with experienced staff to assist you with choosing your time table.



Attend your orientation session

Orientation covers all the important things you need to know and do before you start, such as enrolling into your classes, getting your timetable and collecting your books. You will also meet your other fellow students and find out where everything is around the campus. You can also join a range of fun activities and excursions to help you settle in and begin making friends.

After Orientation, you'll participate in the Academic Preparation Week. It's your first step towards academic success at UTS Insearch. Just like Orientation, it's compulsory you attend because you learn exactly what's expected from you (and what you can expect from your course).

Please bring along any documentation as outlined in the Academic Orientation and Prep Week letter as well as phot ID, such as your passport or driver's license as you will need to show ID to collect your student ID card.

Deferment

Offered stage

UTS Insearch offers are non-binding and you can request a revised offer anytime. Depending on the circumstances we may re-assess your application. Our friendly staff is here to <u>assist you</u>.

Course commenced

Domestic students can withdraw from their program up to the CENSUS date of their first semester study without incurring academic or financial penalty, or FEE-HELP debt. Students must follow the correct process when requesting to withdraw to ensure that the withdrawal can be finalized by the CENSUS date. You can find more information in our Academic Handbook and the Deferring Student Enrolment Policy. Deferral requests made after the first semester CENSUS date has passed are made on a case by case basis and in accordance with the Deferring and Cancelling Student Enrolment Policy. Fees and charges

Recognition of prior learning

If you are seeking exemption from subjects at UTS Insearch based on an equivalent level of study at a previous institution, you can apply at the same time as submitting your application for entry into UTS Insearch. Applications for exemptions with all necessary documentation can be made up until the end of week one of the first semester of study at UTS Insearch. The UTS Insearch <u>Assessment Policy</u> outlines the principles on formal examinations, moderation, appeals against grades, special consideration and special needs. UTS Insearch uses an assessment method that refers to pre-set criteria resulting in grades: High Distinction, Distinction, Credit, Pass, Fail.
