

# Reduced Study Load


Students are permitted to undertake a reduced study load in Autumn 2020 if they are facing difficulty due to remote learning. Students wishing to do so need to lodge an application for reduced study load.



## Professional language support

Embedding English Language (EEL)

- EEL project is continuing.
- Extensive redesign of learning materials to address the online context.
- Delivering fully online Language Development Tutorials (previously face to face) using multiple platforms and LMSs.
- OPELA test done by all students (both international and local) when they first commence at UTS)



To address the needs of these students, Language Development Tutorials are offered in 28 UG and PG subjects that are now fully online, a total of 83 tutorials.

### Exams

On-campus invigilated exams will not be an option in the current COVID-19 restricted environment

Academics are looking to replace exams with suitable alternatives

Faculties will determine which subjects need to retain an exam (e.g. for accreditation purposes) - will transition to a secure online format for Autumn session.



## **Library Services**

Temporary closure of the UTS Library and Reading Room as per the NSW government regulations, students can still contact the Library online, via phone, or through Zoom for study support and consultations.

Steps are being taken to ensure students who do not have access to computers, Wi-Fi and textbooks are not disadvantaged.

Students may still request loan items from the Library, which will be delivered to a secure collection area.

The UTS Central computer, printing and study spaces are still open. Students are advised to practise social distancing when in these spaces and around campus.



### Careers

UTS Careers is transitioning face-to-face services to an online environment.

Existing online resources, such as CareerHub, remain available.

1. Online Resources includes: Careers Blog, Video Interview Practice Tool, Career Action Plan

3. Instant Resume Check Online - RateMyResume resource

2. UTS CareerHub - students can log in to gain access to industry led events plus work-ready competitions

4. 15 minute Virtual Drop-In sessions available with the option to follow up with a more extensive Career Consultation.



# Health and Wellbeing

### **UTS Health Service**

- Remains open for students who require assistance.
- Medical services are also being provided via phone or video conferencing where suitable.

### Batyr

- UTS is working with mental health organisation Batyr to ensure resources for students dealing with stress and anxiety, whether COVID-19-related or more generally.
- A range of online and over-the-phone services students can access.

### **UTS Counselling**

Continues to operate and has the flexibility to provide counselling via phone and Zoom to UTS students.

### **UTS Accessibility Unit**

- Provides assistance for all students living with one or more disabilities, medical, or mental health conditions.
- The UTS Accessibility Unit assists students in accessing services and make requests for assessment arrangements. Students can register with Accessibility at any time during their degree.

### UTS Counselling Student Self-Help Guide

- This resource is constantly updated.
- covers an array of topics, such as managing stress related to COVID-19.



# Clubs, Sports and Societies

ActivateUTS is working to provide online services to cater to all aspects of student life, ranging from digital social events and interactive competitions to home sport workout routines.

ActivateFit Gym has closed until further notice as per advice from the NSW government.

Non-essential services including student events and club activities have been postponed for the remainder of the Autumn session.










# **UTS** Housing

UTS Housing remains open to residents. Additional precautions to protect students include:

- Increased sanitation procedures in each residence.
- Nursing staff available on-site 24/7.
- Reductions in the numbers of guests allowed to visit.
- Identifying isolation rooms for UTS students who require it.
- Cancelling all social and academic events until further notice.





# On-Campus Services Still Open

Most UTS campus facilities remain open at this stage.

This includes research labs and study spaces.

In-person learning will still occur for subjects that as yet cannot be brought online.

Increased hygiene and social-distancing measures are in practice to ensure compliance with NSW Health recommendations.

Graduate research students are still able to use campus facilities to study and conduct research.



# Hardship Fund



# A\$10 million

Hardship fund for UTS students affected by the COVID-19 travel restrictions


To be eligible, students need to be enrolled in Autumn 2020.

• Student were affected by the Australian travel bans that came into effect in February 2020.

 Students need to be in Australia to make a claim. Students currently not in Australia can save their receipts and lodge their claim when they arrive in Sydney.

 The total amount payable to each student will be determined based on their individual circumstances and actual additional costs incurred.

# COVID-19 Student Support Package

In response to the global coronavirus health crisis, UTS has increased their total support funds to A\$15-million as part of the Student Support Package to assist impacted students.

To be eligible for the Student Support Package including grants and loans, you must be:

- A UTS student at the time of application;
   and
- Enrolled after UTS Autumn session 2020 census date or after the UTS Spring 2020 census date in an Award Undergraduate, Postgraduate or HDR Course; and
- in Australia.
- residing in UTS Housing for UTS Housing Rental Subsidy assistance.

Depending on your circumstances you can apply for assistance with:

Each claim requires supporting documentation.

Interest-free loan (up to A\$3,000), flexible repayment, repaid prior to graduation; and/or

Grants (up to A\$1,500) to assist with education-related expenses; living expenses; practical/placement course requirements and equipment; digital access—computer hardware/device, software and internet access; and/or

UTS Student Housing rental subsidies (up to A\$2,000), applicable to UTS Housing residents only

# Online Study Option

 Similar to Autumn 2020, UTS is making arrangements to offer classes fully online in Spring 2020 for students that are unable to or choose not to come to Sydney to commence classes in 2020.

# Important Dates

- Spring 2020 application closing date for offshore applications extended to 15 June 2020.
- Spring 2020 classes start on 27 July 2020.
- Students will be granted an extension of time to enrol until 10 August.

### Deferral

- Students that accept their offer for Spring but wish to defer or withdraw due to the COVID situation will be eligible for a 100% refund of tuition fees if they do so prior to the census date (25 August)
- This will provide students the opportunity to trial remote learning (if required) for 3 weeks before making the decision to continue with no additional cost.

# Admissions Flexibilities for Spring 2020

### **Provisional Offers**

### Available to students that are

- Unable to provide certified documents due to the current situation.
- Unable to provide a statement of completion for their Bachelor degree but have all their results including final semester results.

### With a Provisional Offer

- Students can accept the offer and enrol at UTS.
- Provide the outstanding documentation by 10 August 2020. If they are unable to provide the documents by this date they must contact UTSI prior to 10 August to negotiate a new due date.
- Students that fail to provide outstanding documents by the due date will be automatically withdrawn from UTS.

- Copies of original documents.
- Results released in 2020 downloaded from the official institution website.

### Questions

If a student is unable to commence study on campus in Spring 2020 what options are available?

If I commence study online and the travel bans are lifted during Spring semester but I do not want to come to Sydney until next year can I continue my study?

If I am unable to arrive in Sydney until the end of Spring semester but study online and fail a subject can I have my fees transferred to next semester and have no fail recorded?

What is the maximum number of subjects I can study if I commence my course in Summer semester?

#### Answers

With the exception of a small number of courses that are unsuitable for delivery online, student will be able to study all other courses fully online.

Yes. UTS will continue to offer your course online till the end of Spring semester

If you are unable to arrive in Australia to study in Spring 2020 and study online, if you fail a subject your fees for the subject will be transferred to next semester and no fail grade will be recorded.

You can take four 6cp subjects or three 8cp subjects depending on your course. The standard full-time load per semester is 24cp.

### Questions

If I accept my offer for Spring 2020 and commence online study but then decide to withdraw can I get a 100% tuition fee refund?



#### Answers

You will be eligible for a 100% refund of tuition fees paid if you withdraw prior to the census date and

- were outside Australia when you accepted your offer and are currently back in your home country OR
- were in Australia when you accepted your offer (regardless of where you are currently located) OR
- have had your student visa application refused for reasons other than fraud.

If you accepted your offer while you were outside of Australia and you are in Australia when you request your refund, you will only be eligible for a 100% refund if you return to your home country and notify the Department of Home Affairs that you do not wish to study at UTS.

### Questions

If I am studying online in Spring 2020 can I reduce my study load?

If I am not planning to come to Sydney this year but want to study online in Spring 2020 do I still have to pay the full semester fee to accept my offer?

If I accept my offer and pay for Spring intake, enrol in a few units online but do not get a visa later, will I receive a refund?

#### Answers

Yes you can reduce your study load.

Yes you do. However, if you reduce your study load any fees you have paid for the subjects you do not study will be transferred to the next semester.

Yes you will receive a 100% refund of the tuition fees paid but you will not receive any record of subjects completed in Spring. Alternatively, if you want a record of subjects completed you will not receive a refund of the fees.



### Questions

If I undertake online study in Spring 2020 will I get a discount?

No. Online learning can be an extremely effective mode of education, and teaching in non face-to-face modes has always been a key part of the UTS learning approach. Critical to the UTS model is access to academics and other students – our online experience has been designed to maximise this. UTS also provides a plethora of other student support, networking and learning enhancement programs (e.g. HELPS) which have also been made available online. As a leading university of technology, UTS proudly harnesses technology in every aspect of its day to day operations.

#### Answers




